About GWRPC

The Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission's Economic Development District consists of the following seven counties in Illinois: Crawford, Edwards, Lawrence, Richland, Wabash, Wayne, and White. The office of the Commission is located at 10 West Main Street, P.O. Box 209, Albion, IL 62806. Regional Planning Commissions are voluntary multi-service entities formed under Illinois law by counties, municipalities and towns to serve local government planning needs. There are currently 14 multi-county regional councils and about the same number of single-county councils in Illinois having at least one full-time staff person. Regional Planning Commissions were established under Chapter 55 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes. Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission (GWRPC) was officially established by the Edwards, Wabash and White County boards. Wayne County was annexed into the Commission in 1971, Lawrence County was added in October 1998, Richland County in December 1998, and Crawford County in 2001.

GWRPC has a 26-member board appointed by county elected officials. GWRPC has a staff that provides technical expertise, educational opportunities and support in the spirit of collaboration.

Affiliations

Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission is a federally designated Economic Development District by the United States Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration.

GWRPC is a member of the Illinois Association of Regional Councils, ILARC. ILARC serves as the recognized organization representing regional councils at the state level. ILARC is a non-profit, non-partisan association that promotes and defends the interests and activities of regional councils.

GWRPC serves as a Local Development District for the Delta Regional Authority. The Local Development District consists of White County. In the capacity of LDD, the planning commission prepares and distributes information on the Delta Regional Authority as well as prepares and submits DRA investments on a yearly basis.

Non-Monetary

DRA Opportunity Zones

GWRPC partnered with Greater Egypt Regional Planning & Development Commission, Southern Five Regional Planning District & Development Commission, Southwestern Illinois Metropolitan and Regional Planning Commission, and Southeastern Illinois Regional Planning and Development Commission on a regional project to create a regional Opportunity Zone investment prospectus. The purpose of Opportunity Zones is to spur economic development and job creation in under-resourced communities through tax incentives for investors with recent capital gains. Investors invest capital gains in qualified projects in zones through Qualified Opportunity Zones and receive federal capital gains tax reductions and/or elimination. The program was created as part of the Tax cuts and Job Act of 2017. The purpose of the prospectus is to educate local leaders and investors on the many opportunities this new investment incentive has created, spur ideas for the use of opportunity tax incentives, and create a regional prospectus.

GWRPC received a grant from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to conduct a planning study for a bike/walking path in White County between Grayville, IL and New Harmony, IN. The result of this planning study will be a written report back to IDOT and the public. Mike Gill, Grant Administrator, has been working on the report and hosting steering committee meetings since November 2018 and will be submitting the report September 2020.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND

GWRPC has an U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) funded Revolving Loan Fund available to businesses within the seven-county district. Over the life of the loan program, GWRPC has made 61 loans totaling over \$3.6 million that has led to the creation and retention of over 800 jobs in the region. The GWRPC RLF has a current capital base of \$940,000. GWRPC is currently providing Revolving Loan Fund services to 10 businesses in the district and has money available to lend. GWRPC made 1 new loan in 2019.

DELTA REGIONAL AUTHORITY

The Delta Regional Authority works to improve regional economic opportunity by helping to create jobs, build communities, and improve the lives of the 10 million people who reside in the 252 counties and parishes of the eight-state Delta region. Led by the Delta Regional Authority Board-comprised of the Federal Co-Chairman, appointed by the President and confirmed by the U.S. Senate, and the governors of the eight states-the Delta Regional Authority fosters local and regional partnerships that address economic and social challenges to ultimately strengthen the Delta economy and the quality of life for Delta residents. GWRPC is a Local Development District for the Delta Regional Authority. The Local Development District consists of White County. (The DRA region was set by Congress and includes 15 southern Illinois Counties.) In the capacity of LDD, the planning commission prepares and distributes information on the Delta Regional Authority as well as prepares and submits DRA investments on a yearly basis.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION

In addition to grant writing and administrative services, GWRPC has provided the seven- county region with many non-monetary services. The most important service that GWRPC offers the district is the fact that they continue to represent the seven-county district with the United States Department of Commerce: Economic Development Administration as the official Economic Development District. GWRPC is responsible for writing and maintaining the District's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). As the District Organization, we appoint and facilitate a CEDS Committee that will help to develop this document.



GWRPC, in partnership with Southern Illinois University, assisted all seven counties with the creation and updating of the FEMA required Hazard Mitigation Plan. The purpose of the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) is to help communities implement hazard mitigation measures following a Presidential major disaster declaration. Hazard mitigation is any action taken to reduce or eliminate long term risk to people and property from natural hazards. Mitigation planning is a key process used to breaking the cycle of disaster damage, reconstruction, and repeated damage. To be eligible for Hazard Mitigation Grant funds, a jurisdiction must have a FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan. Plans must be updated, and FEMA approved every 5 years.


COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

GWRPC has been working with all communities to upgrade residential community infrastructure as well as strategies to increase quality of life. GWRPC works closely with the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity and provides grant writing and administration for the US HUD- Community Development Block Grant which is administered through the State of Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity. Currently GWRPC is working with City of Lawrenceville, Lawrence County on behalf of the Petrolia Water District, City of Carmi, City of Olney and City of Grayville, on CDBG Public Infrastructure grants. GWRPC also administered a CDBG Housing Rehabilitation Grant for the City of Olney that rehabilitated 7 homes in a target area at no cost to the homeowners.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

GWRPC has been working with all communities to create infrastructure needed for economic development within the region. GWRPC works closely with the Economic Development Directors in each County on projects. GWRPC is currently administering an EDA Public Works grant for the City of Carmi to rehabilitate Industrial Drive in Carmi. The road currently does not have storm sewers and several local businesses are affected by flooding.

USDA/RD STRONGER ECONOMIES TOGETHER



Stronger Economies Together (SET) is an initiative launched in 2009 by USDA Rural Development in collaboration with the four Regional Rural Development Centers (RRDCs) and their land-grant university partners, including the Purdue Center for Regional Development. The purpose of SET is to strengthen the capacity of communities/counties in rural America to work together in developing and implementing an economic development blueprint that strategically builds on the current and emerging economic strengths of their region. Essentially, we are focusing on working with neighboring counties to capitalize on available assets and work together to decrease economic obstacles. The SET process has occurred or is occurring in 28 states.

The Greater Wabash Region counties (Crawford, Edwards, Lawrence, Richland, Wabash, Wayne and White) were selected in 2015 to participate in a USDA Rural Development Program that provides training and technical assistance to counties engaged in economic development planning. The SET program is provided through a partnership between USDA Rural Development, the nation's four Regional Rural Development Centers, and University of Illinois Extension.
